



What are the iSchools?

The iSchools are interested in the relationship between information, people, and technology. This is characterized by a commitment to learning and understanding the role of information in human endeavors. The iSchools take it as given that expertise in all forms of information is required for progress in science, business, education, and culture. This expertise must include understanding of the uses and users of information, the nature of information itself, as well as information technologies and their applications.

At present, 25 institutions of higher education are members of the iSchools (see list at right). Each school has substantial sponsored research activity (an average of \$1 million in research expenditures per year over three years), engagement in the training of future researchers (usually through an active, research-oriented doctoral program), and a commitment to progress in the information field.
